Throughout the stories of the Old Testament, the people are called into covenant life with God. A promise of trust is established between God and all of creation. But over and over again, the people change their minds and break their promises. What doesn't change, though, is God's unfailing love for these imperfect deal breakers. This Lent, we will engage with the Scripture lessons and see what we might learn about ourselves and about God from Old Testament covenant teaching. The Gifts of God for the People of God: An Interactive and Instructed Eucharist

Why do we pray such a long prayer on Sundays before communion? What is really happening to the bread and the wine? The Holy Eucharist is saturated with words, symbols and gestures that point to deeper meaning. Ever wonder what that deeper meaning is? In an interactive set-up that encourages questions and engagement, we will participate in an Instructed Eucharist at the close of our Wednesday night supper series. As we prepare for Holy Week and Easter, let's draw closer to one of the chief expressions of our worship of Jesus Christ, the Holy Eucharist.

All five Wednesday night parish gatherings include supper for the whole family from 5:30 to 6:15 p.m. Programs will be presented from 6:15 to 7:00 p.m. The cost for supper will be \$7 for adults and \$5 for children younger than 12, with a maximum cost per family of \$20. After supper, child care for children three years old and younger will be available in room 107 off the Preschool hallway. A program exploring the *A Promise is a Promise* theme will be offered for Pre-K students through fifth graders in the chapel.

Rector's Forum Lenten Series
Searching for a Script: The Ethics of Living a Christian Faith

Christian ethics is the way we do worship beyond any constraints of time and place. While it might be tempting to see worship as a rehearsal and life as the “real thing,” the opposite is true: a life lived ethically is the way we prepare to worship. This Lent, we will explore the aspects of prayer, penitence and reconciliation, intercession, offering and witness as they are expressed in the worship service, and see what connections we might make to how we live ethically in the world. Sessions will build on the work of Stanley Hauerwas and the Rev. Samuel Wells. Books by both authors are in the St. Paul’s library and St. Paul’s Bookshop.

Episcopal 101 Confirmation Class

Our life together in the Episcopal Church involves a participation in our shared history, theology and practices of prayer and worship. Whether you are a new Episcopalian or have been one for decades, this class will address these aspects of our faith that serve as the cornerstones of our Anglican identity. Weekly topics include church history, Anglican history, scripture, *The Book of Common Prayer*, stewardship and outreach, and Episcopal polity.

Know Thyself: The Enneagram as a Path of Grace and Mercy

Building on the winter Enneagram seminar, this class will explore the nine personality types of the Enneagram model of the human psyche. Each type experiences change, stress, love

and community differently, and we will learn not only about the intricacies of our individual types, but our relationships to other types around the circle. The class schedule is as follows:

- March 4 – Three: The Achiever
- March 11 – Four: The Individualist

- May 6 – Nine: The Peacemaker

Wednesday Holy Eucharist

Except for on Ash Wednesday, a service of Holy Eucharist will be offered each Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. at the side altar in the nave and at 5:30 p.m. in the chapel.

The Stations of the Cross

St. Paul’s clergy will lead the Stations of the Cross liturgy in the nave at noon on Wednesdays from February 21 through March 28. Parishioners may walk the Stations of the Cross in the nave and chapel on their own during church office hours throughout Lent. Booklets containing the liturgy will be available at the back of the nave and on the table outside the chapel.

The Labyrinth

The Labyrinth will be open during church office hours on Mondays through Thursdays during Lent, accessible through the Goodheart Entrance. Based on the labyrinth in the floor of Chartres Cathedral in France, St. Paul’s Labyrinth is etched into the floor of the chapel, a balanced, circular walking path with seven concentric circles, leading from an outer entry point to the center. As a true labyrinth, it offers a single, purposeful pathway, with no dead ends, and can be walked by people of all faiths. Some people pray as they walk, opening their minds and hearts to God’s peace and the presence of the Holy Spirit, while others meditate, as they follow the path to the center and back out again into the world.
